Together with 4 other countries, it was not easy to set up a unique and unforgettable project, but the efforts were worth it, says Maria Schwarz, President of the Austria eXtreme Triathlon. Every successful participation will be rewarded with a puzzle medal. Those who have mastered five eXtreme Triathlons in three years will hold a unique trophy in their hands. Every collected puzzle medal finds a worthy place in this trophy. Even in the Extreme Triathlon Series, each individual triathlon remains independent and maintains its own personal philosophy. Strength, intelligence, emotion - a successful triathlete needs all of these. This is exactly what will be put to the test on all 5 courses.

The Extreme Triathlon Series started in 2021 in Spain



Pirene Xtreme Triathlon, 01.06.2024

will start in Terradets Reservoir. Athletes will cross part of the Pyrenees and experience the unique flora and fauna of the region along the route. This particularly demanding triathlon includes an altitude climb of 4400 m, which will be covered by bike over a distance of 177 km and a 40 km trail run. The latter takes participants to the highest point of the route - the Prat De Bacies plateau, 2200 m above sea level. This triathlon puts body and mind to a demanding test, which is not only rewarded with the finish. Majestic mountains, unique landscapes and historic villages are part of the route that make the triathlon unforgettable.



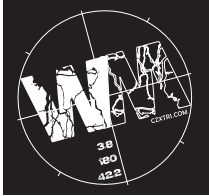
Austria eXtreme Triathlon, 22.06.2024

starts in the south of Graz. A jump into the cold water of the Mur forms the starting signal. Even in midsummer, its temperatures do not exceed 14 °C. The 3.8 km swim is followed by 186 km of cycling and 44 km of running. But it is not the length of the course that is the real challenge. During the bike course, the participants are exposed to a difference in altitude of almost 3900 m. The subsequent run course has 1800 m of altitude. The subsequent run course has 1850 metres of altitude difference. This triathlon means pure nature and leads from lush green fields to the snow-covered mountains of the Dachstein masiv.

STONEBRIXIAMAN XTREME TRIATHLON PONTE DI LEGNO

Stonebrixiaman, 29.06.2024

starts at 4 a.m. with a 3.8 km swim. In Sulzano it's out of the water and onto the bike. The 180 km route leads towards Vello Toline, along the Val Camonica valley and finally ends in the municipality of Ponte di Legno. Now follows a 42 km run. The highest point of the entire route is at 2600 m above sea level. To complete such a demanding triathlon requires a lot of ambition and willpower - and perhaps also some positive insanity.



Winterman, 13.10.2024

A fairytale landscape of the Czech Republic makes the course so special. The extraordinary start of the triathlon alone is something no participant will ever experience again in this form. Everything starts in absolute darkness in ice-cold water. More than 3000 metres of altitude are covered on the bike course, which explains the comparatively low average speed of 20 to 26 km/h. During the 43 km long run, the finish line can already be seen and gives the participants a proper motivation boost. The last part ends with a steep rocky climb up to the 1012 m high Jested, which rewards every finish runner with a breathtaking view, and drives the emotions up high.

KNYSNA EXTREME TRIATHLON

Knysna Extreme Triathlon, 02.11.2024

The race starts with a 5 km swim in the Knysna Estuary lagoon. The following 174 km will be cycled through coastal, mountainous and semi-desert areas. The race continues with a 50 km run along Prince Alfred's Pass. It takes participants through mountain valleys, fields and forests of Karoo to Diepwalle Forest Station. This route not only tests your fitness level, but also your mental strength and fighting spirit.

COMMUNITY OF ÖBLARN

A PLACE WITH CULTURAL DIVERSITY AND LONG-STANDING TRADITIONS

With the „Grimming“ mountain on one side of the valley and the „Gumpeneck“ on the other, the local natural and cultural treasures of the „Ennstal“ come together in the **community of Öblarn**. Rarely have old values been so lovingly preserved over generations and remained unchanged until the present day. The preservation of traditions and customs is at the heart of active village life, which is maintained by the commitment of many locals. This becomes particularly visible every five years during the performances of the largest amateur theater in the Alpine region, the festival **"Die Hochzeit"**, written by the famous **Öblarn poet Prof. Paula Grogger**. At the center of the plot is Archduke Johann, who was the bride's male attendant and used the wedding as an opportunity to meet his beloved Anna Plochl. Lively hustle and bustle on the market square, many conversations about secret love and the worries of the population, as well as almost forgotten traditions, envelop the plot like a cloak. This summer, once again, the village transforms into a stage for over 300 local actors to perform **"Die Hochzeit"** in this unique setting. In addition to the **"Die Hochzeit"**, the **„Öblarner Krampuspiel“** (created around 1890) has also become a cultural highlight, attracting audience from near and far.

The new built event center **"ÖhA - Öblarner Haus für alle"**, also offers space for all kind of performances and is the headquarter for more than 40 associations that ensure strong cohesion. Not only the ÖhA provides the perfect stage for various events, but the **Kunst- und Kulturhaus [ku:L]** association also ensures a varied program and numerous events for culture enthusiasts. Cultural and social cohesion have always contributed to a strong community life.

Especially after the devastating floods in 2017, when the entire town center was flooded due to log jams and the subsequent cleanup could only be accomplished with the help of the population. After this event, a remarkable project was launched in collaboration with „Moosmoar Energies OG“. The **„Wassererlebnis-Öblarn“** - a natural hazard simulation model that conveys information and knowledge in a playful way through target group-oriented tours, strengthening awareness of natural hazards. Numerous schools, senior groups, families, and community delegations have already visited this tourist attraction. Another option is to visit the copper mine **„Kupferbergwerk“**, which offers a glimpse into Öblarn's mining history. For those who want to take to the skies, the **„Alpenflugschule Niederöblarn“** offers opportunities for sightseeing flights, aerobatics, or introductory flights. Guests also appreciate the atmosphere and hospitality encountered in the cafés and restaurants in the community, alongside these attractions and the impressive landscape.

Blind triathlete: Emotional adventure at Austria's toughest triathlon!

Athlete Ondrej Zmeskal takes on the challenge of the „Austria eXtreme Triathlon“ and sets an example for inclusion.

On 22 June 2024, history will be made in Styria when Ondrej Zmeskal, who is blind and only 33 years old, becomes the first athlete with a disability to take part in Austria's toughest triathlon. The key data for this event are 3.8 km up&down swim in the Mur, 186 km with 4000 metres of cycling to finally run 43.6 km with 2000 metres of climbing. In an exclusive interview, he gives us an insight into his unique journey and the challenges he has to overcome on the way to the start. Ondrej, who has been addicted to triathlon for several years, has worked his way through a variety of competitions, including World Cups, sprint distances, Xterra and even Ironman events. His love of the sport and constant drive for new challenges eventually led him to the Austria eXtreme Triathlon, a competition known for its extreme conditions.

The organisers of the Austria eXtreme Triathlon have always focu-

sed on the spirit of inclusion and diversity. Through their support and openness, they enable athletes like Ondrej to push their limits while sending a message of inclusion to the sporting world.

„I have been given the opportunity by the organisers to showcase my skills and highlight the importance of inclusion in triathlon,“ explains Ondrej. „It's not only my personal goal, but also a step towards a more inclusive future in sport.“

Preparing for such a competition requires dedication and a smart approach. As a blind athlete, Ondrej relies on his supporter. To prepare for each of the triathlon disciplines, he trains in his home gym and uses simulators for cycling and running while training in the pool with his supporter.

One of the biggest challenges is swimming, where navigation is crucial. According to ITU rules, an 80



cm rope is stretched between Ondrej and his supporter to give him a guideline. Especially in adverse conditions such as wind and waves, this requires maximum coordination and confidence.

Despite the additional difficulties associated with his visual impairment, Ondrej competes like any other triathlete - with the exception of a tandem bike and the permitted rope.

When asked about role models and athletes who inspire him, Ondrej answers modestly: „We like everyone who is friendly and says ‚hello‘ and wants to chat. Every athlete has their own story and challenges,

and that’s what makes the sport so special.“

Ondrej’s participation in the Austria eXtreme Triathlon is not only a personal triumph, but also an inspiring example of the unlimited power of the human will. On 22 June, the world will be looking at Ondrej, who is not only going his own way, but also pioneering work for future generations of athletes with disabilities.

As the organisers of the Austria eXtreme Triathlon have a positive approach to disabled sport, they are looking forward to Ondrej’s participation and wish him every success.

At the heart of triathlon

A dialogue with Felix Walchshöfer

Felix Walchshöfer is the central figure behind the Roth Triathlon, an event that is known far beyond the borders of Germany for its unique atmosphere and challenging course. As part of the family that created this legendary event, Felix shares a deep connection and passion for the sport of triathlon. However, his

vision goes far beyond the competition, creating a community of athletes, volunteers and spectators who come together to push the boundaries of what is possible. Felix Walchshöfer's commitment and dedication have made the Roth Triathlon a must-do event in the calendar of triathletes worldwide.

How do you deal with unexpected problems or emergencies during your triathlon event?

I am very grateful that I have a great team at my side, in which many gears mesh together. The individual sections have years of experience and know how to deal with most situations professionally. If something unforeseen should happen, we have a crisis team made up of emergency services, political institutions and other people involved, who can make quick and efficient decisions in the event of an emergency.

What strategies do you use to attract sponsors and partners for your triathlon events in order to build long-term relationships?

Our goal is to more than fulfil the expectations of sponsors. We always try to find individual solu-

tions for our partners. Together as a team, we also want to find creative ways for new sponsors and think outside the box. This enables us to work together to ensure that the sponsor's goals are achieved in the best possible way. Regular discussions are essential for a trusting partnership.

What trends are you currently observing in the field of triathlon events and how do you plan to adapt to them?

There are two main issues that are challenging for many event organisers. Firstly, the issue of volunteers. We want to offer not only our athletes but also our volunteers a great event. This is only possible with great appreciation. On the Monday after the race, we therefore celebrate a big volunteer party with the volunteers

every year with a raffle, top professionals and a specially made volunteer film.

The topic of sustainability is also becoming increasingly important. We have identified seven topics for ourselves based on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, e.g. inclusion and social responsibility. We are of course aware of our responsibility here and want to improve year on year..

What are your future plans and visions for the organisation of your triathlon event?

Especially in times of great social upheaval, we want to provide an

anchor for the triathlon district and all triathlon fans. The race is a good example of how much can be achieved together. Without the support of the municipalities, the fire brigades, our volunteers and the volunteers, an event of this size would not be possible..

How do you deal with personal criticism?

I am very happy to receive constructive criticism, as this is the only way to improve. In our after-race survey, the athletes often tell us what we can improve for the coming year. The feedback is a huge blessing for us..

A dark figure and the Austria eXtreme Triathlon

It's the end of June again. It's night, just before 3am and I'm dodging last night's paintwork on my way through the Mur floodplains in my Ghost Walk costume.

My lamp conjures up thin reflections on the water of the Lacken and the animals in the nearby water world announce loudly that it should be quiet at night. The figures hurrying around with headlamps keep saying „morning“ out loud.

The Austria eXtreme Triathlon starts again today!

It all started with a phone call from a certain Maria Schwarz. We met in Graz, even though I didn't know what I had to do in extreme sports at night. In words that were confusing to me, Mrs Schwarz explained to me what I should do and where.

Good. So, at the very first Austria eXtreme Triathlon, I was faced with a large group of athletes in their wetsuits, who had long since been swimming in the dark waters of the Mur towards the first turning point. A story to loosen things up before the start.

And no matter how hard I tried, only their bodies were standing around impatiently, their minds were already swimming.

It wasn't going to work like that, I realised.

It's somewhere between half and full hour. At half past two, I parked my car along the side road and, to my amazement, other cars were already standing around.

After several years with the eXtreme Triathlon, I have become part of the eXtreme Tri-athlon team. Which makes me really happy. As the presumed only non-athlete.

So I stand off the beaten track so that nobody runs me down at 3 o'clock in the morning because they can't see me in the dark. The figure unfolds in the truest sense of the word as the light increases and the lamp on its stick becomes visible.

The fire brigade with its boat greets me in a friendly manner as it passes by. A crew member has a little chat with me.

The day slowly wakes up and more and more athletes arrive with their coaches. As I'm standing opposite the transition area, I'm visible to everyone.

Some think long and hard about



whether they should approach this figure. There are lots of photos on hundreds of mobile phones, cameras or whatever else you can use to take a photo.

I walk slowly towards the starting area and rather nervous athletes and their carers stumble barefoot past. And when they allow themselves to be photographed with me, I notice how the participant's body relaxes for a moment and only the photo becomes important. And these are

exactly the moments that make me happy.

Because nothing in the world would make me jump into the dark waters of the Mur after the cowbell rang. a lot of boats are waiting for the swimmers so that no one dives off for good.

The Austria eXtreme Triathlon is highly professional and yet warmly familiar.

Which is why I'm here for myself.

...and I painted my own world ...

Our long-standing moderator Josef Pflieger provides plenty to talk about with his artistically designed fabrics.



Even as a young primary school pupil, I was fascinated by working with coloured pencils. As a boy from a rather poor rural background, my painting materials were rather limited and a drawing pad with thick, sturdy sheets of paper was out of the question at the time. Of course, additional training in drawing or painting was out of the question either financially or due to a lack of transport to an art teacher. Therefore, the exercise book, the cover of the maths book or just a white sheet of paper was the target of desire to make it colourful.

Vocational training in Vienna, pretty girls and many other interests pushed coloured pencils to the sidelines in his youth. I had to build a life, start a family and plant the famous tree after my daughter Jennifer was born. My job meant that I had to sit at a desk and scribble drawings on my notepad while I was on the phone. At the end of a stressful working day, the desk pad was often full of drawings and so the desire to be creative arose in me again.

A summer academy in Bad Reichenhall was my introduction to the world of painting, or more precisely to oil painting on canvas. Small, medium and large canvases were painted there every summer over

the course of almost 30 years. The result was several hundred paintings, many exhibitions at home and abroad and the desire to paint more than just pictures.

As chance would have it, a colleague of mine in Vorarlberg was able to establish contact with a large weaving mill, a jacquard fabric weaving mill. At first it was just an attempt, a shy enquiry as to whether it would be possible to get my own fabrics from my own paintings. A company that weaves millions of metres of fabric every year and exports the majority of it successfully, I was allowed to talk shop with the development manager over an espresso, paint my castles in the air, with lots of words and enthusiasm. In short, they accepted me and I was allowed to have my own fabrics woven on their machines. I had made the transition from being a painter of motifs from my heart and stomach to a fabric designer. It was as if Easter and Christmas had coincided on the same day when I held the first fabric from the weaving machine of my own oil paintings in my hands. It was unimaginable how fine the fabric was, usable on both sides, Jacquard weaving, and words cannot describe how it felt.



What followed was more than twelve years of involvement with fabric design, design, tailoring and a lot of creativity. The founding of her own company with three trades was a consequence of this. The „normal work“, i.e. the job, was still there and the fact that I was travelling all over Austria made it possible to visit the weaving mill on business trips. A 40-hour week, yes, I didn't know anything like that, but that didn't matter because I drew my own world in pictures, then had them woven and dressed people in them with the help of master tailors. More than

enough compensation for the time spent. The additional training as a presenter gave and still gives me the chance to wear my own pictures, which I and my daughter have now also painted, in fabric on stage and to advertise them. Now that I'm retired, or should I say unretired, I've been able to give up my day job and concentrate on my special projects. And for the past ten years, it has been a matter close to my heart to present the Austria eXtreme Triathlon!

On that note, see you then, sporting greetings, Karin



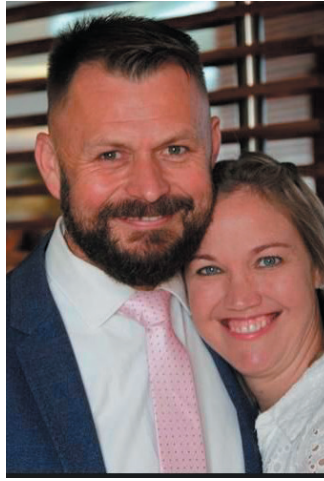

10 years Austria eXtreme Triathlon on film



Since 2014, the production of film documents for the Austria eXtreme Triathlon has continued to evolve and become a fascinating range of audiovisual experiences. From the humble beginnings to the sophisticated productions of recent years, this development reflects not only the progress in technology, but also the growing creativity and commitment of the production team.

The first film, which was created in 2014, was more or less an amateurish work by Hugo Schwarz, which he shot and produced himself. Despite limited resources, he managed to capture the breathtaking beauty of the landscape and the fascination of the triathlon. Although the result may not have been perfect, the film was seen by interested parties from over 30 countries. For us, this was a clear mandate to further exploit the potential in these films and to develop them to perfection.

In the following years, the production became more and more professional. With a growing budget and a dedicated team, the films became technically more sophistica-

ted and narratively more complex. The close collaboration between the organisers of the Austria eXtreme Triathlon and the film team made it possible to capture the atmosphere and emotions of the event even more intensively.

Since 2021, the premiere of the films has been shown in a cinema in Graz as part of „100 Minuten Film & Talk“. A unique event in the Austrian triathlon scene, as we are repeatedly told.

This year's film project entitled „The last part“ will really challenge us all once again. This is exactly what we are looking forward to and we are sure that we as the Austria eXtreme Triathlon team, with the support and realisation of the great filmmaker Rowin Höfer, will achieve this impressively.

The date for the 2024 premiere has already been set. With the Schubertkino in Graz, we have found exactly the right venue according to our ideas and so a mega spectacle will take place there again on 18 September 2024 at 18:00 with a full house!

An odyssey of endurance

From the icy grip of the Mur to the glorious finale under the Dachstein



The challenge of the Austria eXtreme Triathlon begins with a plunge into the cold waters of the Mur, where the athletes fight their way through the current of the river and put their endurance to the test in the cool water. The challenging swim section is followed by the bike course, which is written like an epic poem about the alpine heart of Austria.

Starting at the Gaberl Pass, the athletes climb over 1,550 metres and experience the first of many physical and mental tests of this triathlon. Breathtaking Styria unfolds in all its splendour and provides a picturesque backdrop for the sweat-inducing effort.

The route continues over the Hochegg, a treacherous climb with impressive views. The Kammersberg challenges you with steep sections and challenging bends. Finally, the Sölkpass, the monumental finale of

the cycling stage, awaits. At 1,790 metres above sea level, it provides a stage for the athletes' moments of triumph.

The run course of the Austria eXtreme Triathlon is also a route through the beauty of nature. From the Sölksperrre along the imposing dam, through the unspoilt Strubschlucht gorge to the mystical Silberkarklamm gorge, the runners draw strength from the wilderness that surrounds them. After a short breather at the Glölsalm, the route continues to the Dachstein Südwandhütte, where the path stretches towards the sky.

The finish, at the foot of the Dachstein, is the crowning glory of this extreme test. Here, surrounded by the majestic backdrop of the Alps, the athletes experience a moment of complete euphoria as they cross the finish line - a brilliant end to an extraordinary journey.

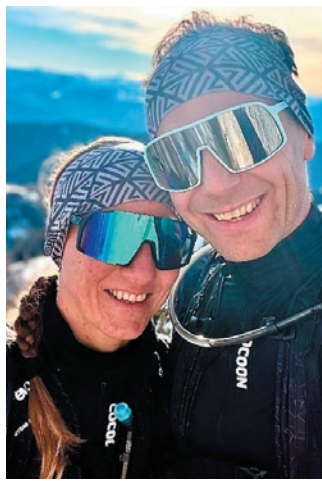

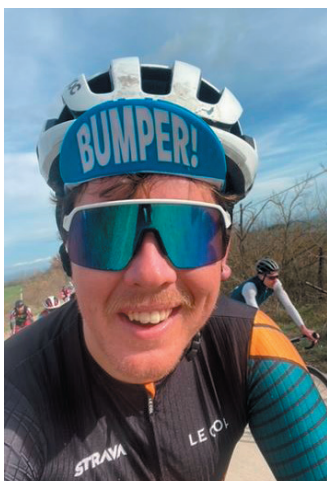

A little farther east meanwhile, Singletrack Haus-Aich offers the kinds of cornering and hill challenges that make kids fall in love with bike sports in no time.

Beyond the Dachstein, a via ferrata center on the Stoderzinken, with its eight variety-packed tours, is the talk of the town, and the practice climbing area at the Burgstall near Pürgg is equally as impressive. There, you can enjoy climbing and chillin' on 180 different routes!

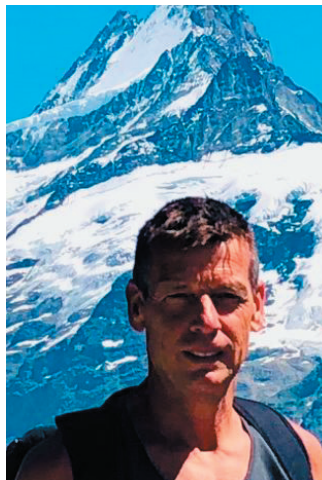

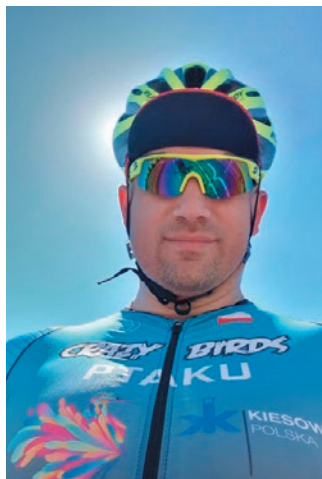

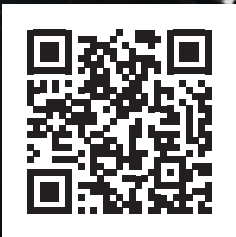
